Buncombe added **181 more** new listings to the market than it took off (put under contract), **which increased the overall supply**. Home sales (*closings*) **increased** in March, just remember that many of those homes went under contract in a *previous* month.

The *total* number of active listings **increased 19%** compared to February, 50% of homes went under contract in **12-days** *or less,* and at this rate there's about **3.7-months of supply** to go around.

March was a Seller's market.

### At A Glance: Pricing (vs. last month) (vs. this month last year)



The average price of a home in Buncombe County was \$2k less than it was this time last March. On average, properties sold for 97% of their list price at the time the offer was made, and 91% of the price they originally listed for.

#### <u>Learn the lingo</u>

Active Listings: This is the total number of listings that were for sale at any given point during the month.

**Under Contract:** This is the total **number** of listings that accepted an offer to purchase *during the month.* 

Under Contract (%): This is the "Under Contract" column represented as a **percentage** of the county.


**Pending Ratio:** This ratio is calculated using a *snapshot* taken at 11:59pm on the last day of the month. It used to show a price range's competitiveness by comparing the number of listings under contract to the total number of listings on the market at the time the snapshot was taken (active + under contract).

 Months of inventory represents how long it would take to deplete the current inventory assuming no new homes are put on the market. It's commonly used to determine the health of a particular market.

Between 0-4 months of inventory is considered a seller's market because supply is relatively low, which means that sellers have more control to set terms or raise prices. 5-7 months signals a *balanced* market there is a healthy mix of buyers and sellers. 8 or more months of inventory indicates a buyer's market, which means buyers have more negotiating power.

### Volume & Activity




- → The number of active listings increased by 19% in March. Total Active listings, the number of properties listed for sale at any point during the month, was up 32% compared to last year.
- → Total homes under contract increased 36% from last month, but Buncombe had 4% less homes under contract in March than it did this time last year.
- → Overall volume was up 15% from last month and up 21% from this time last year.

### Listings & Pendings

- → New listings increased 50% from last month, and were up 17% from last March's numbers.
- → 36% more homes went under contract, but Buncombe had less homes going under contract than this month last year, down 4%.
- → Pro Tip: keeping an eye on the difference between homes added to the market (new listings) and those taken off (by going under contract) is the best way to gauge supply & demand!










The **median price** is the "middle price," meaning half of the homes sold during the month were cheaper and half were more expensive than the median. The **average price** is the total sales divided by number of sales.

- → The average home price in Buncombe County increased 2%, but homes were valued 0% lower compared to last March.
- The positive home value appreciation trend seems to be holding despite interest rates.
   Pro Tip: monthly price fluctuations are less indicative than annual trends for understanding market shifts!
- → The consistently higher average vs. median home price tells us that **Buncombe's** high-end market is strong, with prices significantly higher than the rest of the market.

### Days On Market

- → Homes went under contract 14-days faster, on average, than they did in February, and the median days it took to sign a purchase contract was 12-days (!!!).
- → Homes between \$0-199k sold fastest in March, with a median 4-days on the market, followed by homes in the \$800-899k range, which took a median of 7-days.
- → Homes in Buncombe are selling quickly due to a combination of extremely low inventory and high demand for homes.



The **median DOM** is the "middle DOM," meaning half of the homes during the month went UC faster and half took longer than the median. The **average DOM** is the total DOM divided by number of sales.

### **Contract To Close**



- → Contract to close time took an average of 7-days less compared to last month, which was 13-days faster compared to last March.
- → Homes valued valued up to \$199k took among the longest to close. March closings data put that segment at around 90-days, on average.
- → Homes valued valued between \$350k-399k closed fastest, closing in ~32-days, on average.

### **Contract To Ca\$h**

- → Sellers got paid an average of 22-days faster after listing their homes according to March sales data, and 9-days faster than Mar., 2023.
- → This overall decrease was due to decreases in both time spent during the contract to close process as well as time spent on the market (DOM).
- → Homes valued valued between \$350k-399k sold fastest, averaging 62-days, followed by the valued between \$250k-299k price range which took 67-days, on average.

The median Contract to Ca\$h is the "middle number," meaning half of the homes that closed during the month got paid faster faster and half took longer than the median. The **average Contract to Ca\$h** is the total time it took across all price ranges divided by number of sales.

# Methodology

Data for this report was pulled from Canopy MLS for Single Family and Condo/Townhouse properties on April 3rd, 2025. Realtors are required to update their transactions on the MLS within 48hrs, so while most records for the month should have been accounted for, any updates that occured after the report was pulled will not have made the cut. This should not have a material effect on the data given the overall volume of transactions.
