Polk added **25 more** new listings to the market than it took off (put under contract), **which increased the overall supply**. Home sales (*closings*) **increased** in June, just remember that many of those homes went under contract in a *previous* month.

The *total* number of active listings **increased 11%** compared to May, 50% of homes went under contract in **30-days** *or less*, and at this rate there's about **9.2-months of supply** to go around.

The average price of a home in Polk County was \$66k less than it was this time last June. On average, properties sold for 96% of their list price at the time the offer was made, and 93% of the price they originally listed for.

#### **Learn the lingo**

**Active Listings:** This is the total number of listings that were for sale *at any given point during the month.* 

**Under Contract**: This is the total **number** of listings that accepted an offer to purchase *during the month*.

**Under Contract (%):** This is the "Under Contract" column represented as a **percentage** of the county.


Pending Ratio: This ratio is calculated using a snapshot taken at 11:59pm on the last day of the month. It used to show a price range's competitiveness by comparing the number of listings under contract to the total number of listings on the market at the time the snapshot was taken (active + under contract).

Months of inventory represents how long it would take to deplete the current inventory assuming no new homes are put on the market. It's commonly used to determine the health of a particular market.

Between 0-4 months of inventory is considered a seller's market because supply is relatively low, which means that sellers have more control to set terms or raise prices. 5-7 months signals a balanced market there is a healthy mix of buyers and sellers. 8 or more months of inventory indicates a buyer's market, which means buyers have more negotiating power.

Seller's Market Buyer's Market


# Volume & Activity




- → The number of active listings increased by 11% in June. Total Active listings, the number of properties listed for sale at any point during the month, was up 63% compared to last year.
- → Total homes under contract remained flat from last month, but Polk had 8% more homes under contract in June than it did this time last year.
- → Overall volume was up 8% from last month and up 42% from this time last year.

# Listings & Pendings

- → New listings increased 6% from last month, and were up 43% from last June's numbers.
- → About the same number of homes went under contract, but Polk had more homes going under contract than this month last year, up 8%.
- → Pro Tip: keeping an eye on the difference between homes added to the market (new listings) and those taken off (by going under contract) is the best way to gauge supply & demand!



### **Home Prices**




The median price is the "middle price," meaning half of the homes sold during the month were cheaper and half were more expensive than the median. The average price is the total sales divided by number of sales.

- → The average home price in Polk County increased 9%, but homes were valued 10% lower compared to last June.
- → The positive home value appreciation trend seems to be holding despite interest rates.
  Pro Tip: monthly price fluctuations are less indicative than annual trends for understanding market shifts!
- → The consistently higher average vs. median home price tells us that Polk's high-end market is strong, with prices significantly higher than the rest of the market.

## Days On Market

- → On average, homes took 8-days longer to go under contract than they did in May, and the median days it took to sign a purchase contract was 30-days (!!!).
- → Homes between \$250-299k sold fastest in June, with a median 1-days on the market, followed by homes in the \$400-449k range, which took a median of 4-days.
- → Homes in Polk are selling quickly due to a combination of extremely low inventory and high demand for homes.



The median DOM is the "middle DOM," meaning half of the homes during the month went UC faster and half took longer than the median. The average DOM is the total DOM divided by number of sales.

## **Contract To Close**



- → Contract to close time took an average of 4-days more compared to last month, which was 14-days slower compared to last June.
- → Homes valued valued between \$500k-599k took among the longest to close. June closings data put that segment at around 163-days, on average.
- → Homes valued valued between \$700k-799k closed fastest, closing in ~23-days, on average.

## Contract To Ca\$h

- → Sellers got paid an average of 11-days slower after listing their homes according to June sales data, and 11-days slower than Jun., 2023.
- → This overall increase was a due to increases in both time spent during the contract to close process as well as time spent on the market (DOM).
- → Homes valued valued between \$700k-799k sold fastest, averaging 44-days, followed by the valued between \$250k-299k price range which took 47-days, on average.



The median Contract to Ca\$h is the "middle number," meaning half of the homes that closed during the month got paid faster faster and half took longer than the median. The average Contract to Ca\$h is the total time it took across all price ranges divided by number of sales.

# Methodology

Data for this report was pulled from Canopy MLS for Single Family and Condo/Townhouse properties on July 3rd, 2025. Realtors are required to update their transactions on the MLS within 48hrs, so while most records for the month should have been accounted for, any updates that occured after the report was pulled will not have made the cut. This should not have a material effect on the data given the overall volume of transactions.
