About 73.6% of residents are homeowners, demonstrating strong investment in the community and neighborhood stability. The median household income is \$111,179, and Buda has more people living here who work in computers and math than 95% of the places in the US.

Income & Employment

The median household income in Buda is approximately \$111,179, significantly higher than many surrounding communities. The average commute time is 30.9 minutes, providing excellent access to major job markets while enjoying suburban amenities.

Top employment sectors include technology, education, healthcare, retail, and manufacturing. The proximity to Austin's booming tech sector and major employers like Tesla, Apple, and Google has created significant economic opportunities for Buda residents.

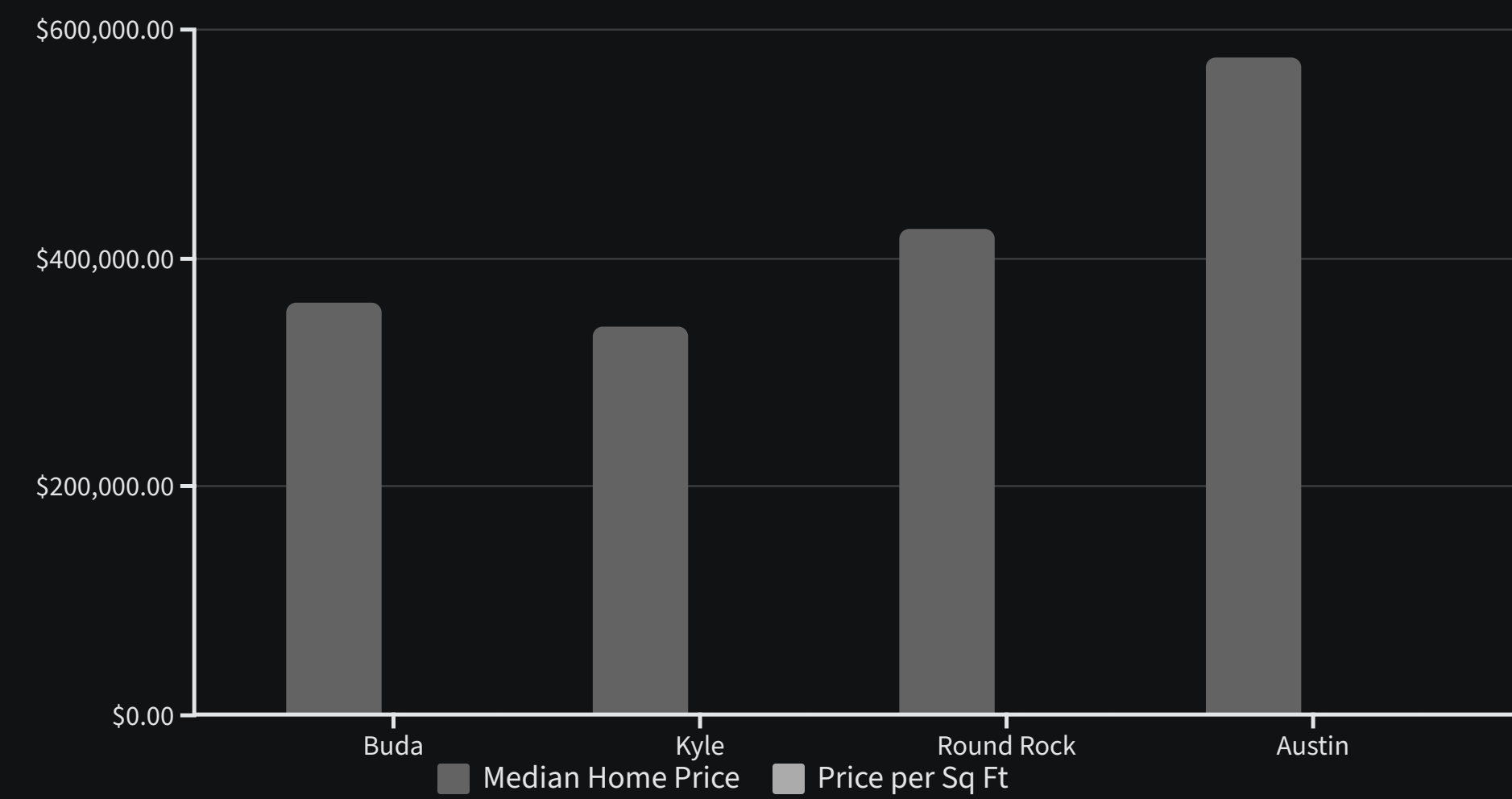

Housing Market Analysis: What to Expect

Buda's housing market offers strong value in the Austin metropolitan area with established neighborhoods and amenities. The median home price in Buda is approximately \$361,131 as of October 2024, down 4% from last year. With a median cost of homes of \$537,816 according to some estimates, Buda real estate is some of the most expensive in Texas, although home values aren't among America's most expensive. Single-family detached homes are the single most common housing type in Buda, accounting for 83.87% of the city's housing units.

The market features a healthy mix of housing options, with 85.74% of Buda's housing built since 2000, making the city have a very new look and feel. If you like the amenities of newer homes and subdivisions, then you will probably like what the Buda real estate market has to offer. Owner-occupied, three and four bedroom dwellings, primarily in single-family detached homes are the most prevalent type of housing you will see in Buda.



Property taxes in Buda are approximately 2.0-2.2% of assessed value annually, which includes county, city, school district, and other local taxes. While Texas has no state income tax, property taxes fund excellent schools and city services. Rental prices for housing average \$1,785 per month for median gross rent, reflecting the community's desirability and quality amenities.

Education Excellence: Schools & Ratings

Hays Consolidated Independent School District (Hays CISD) serves the community with a strong commitment to educational excellence. The district operates schools serving approximately 22,297 students across the greater area. While the district as a whole is ranked 480 out of 961 school districts in Texas and has a 3-star rating, several standout schools within the district demonstrate exceptional academic performance.



Elementary Schools

Buda Elementary is a public school located in Buda, TX, in a large suburb setting. The student population is 604 and the school serves PK-5. At Buda Elementary, 50% of students scored at or above the proficient level for math, and 62% scored at or above that level for reading. The school's minority student enrollment is 67%.



Middle Schools

The district operates several middle schools serving grades 6-8, with Niche ratings of A-minus overall. These schools offer advanced academics, athletics, fine arts, and extensive extracurricular activities. The district emphasizes STEM education and college readiness preparation.



High Schools

Jack C Hays High School is a public school in Buda, TX, offering AP courses, Project Lead The Way curriculum, and a Gifted & Talented program. It is one of 5 high schools in Hays Consolidated Independent School District and is performing average compared to public and charter schools in Texas. The district offers dual credit programs, career and technical education, and competitive athletics.

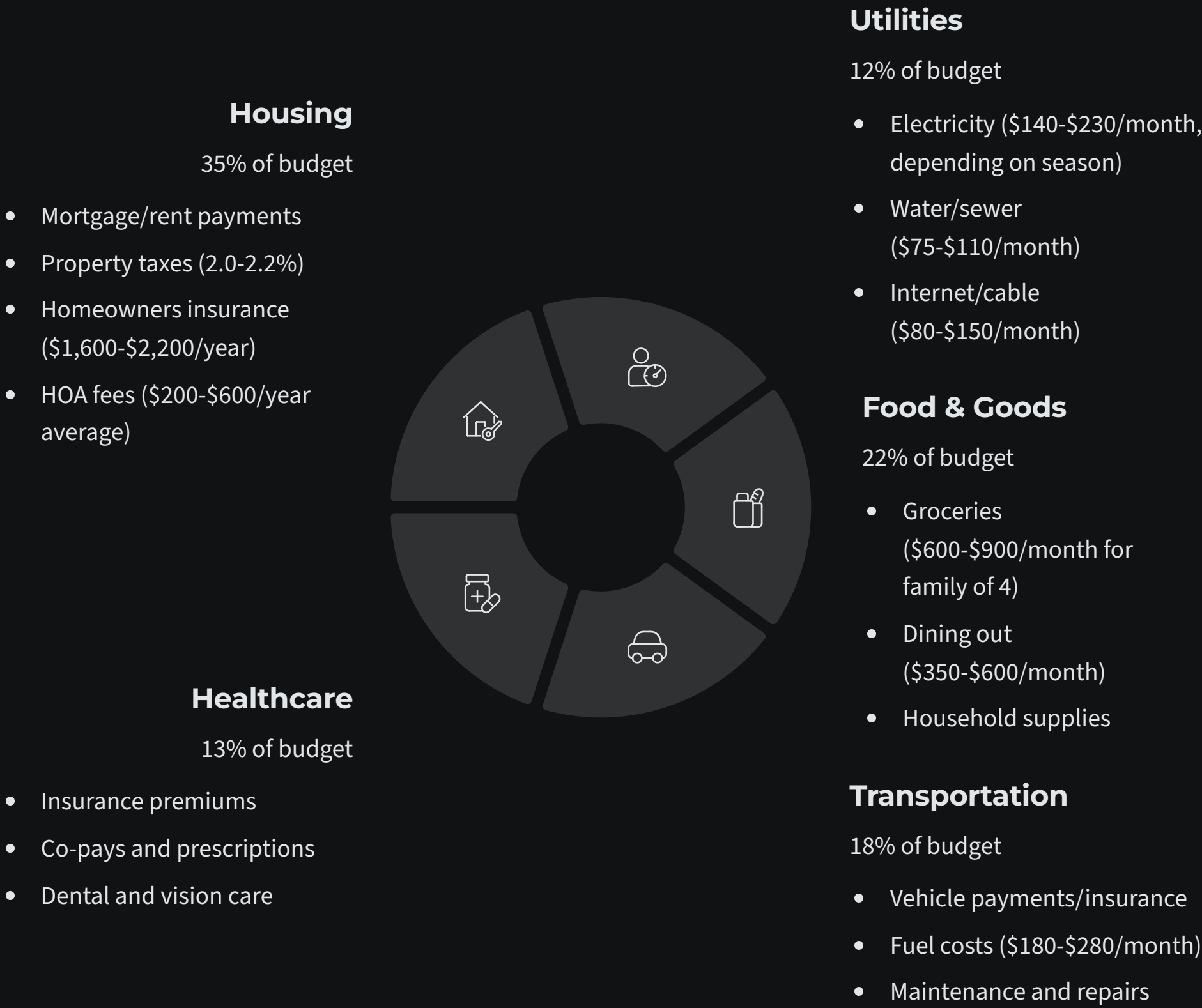

Austin Community College and nearby universities provide accessible higher education opportunities for residents pursuing associate and bachelor's degrees.
