Although warmer weather is behind us, the Pickleball players are still signing up for play on the courts near the sports center. Scheduled play continues on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 1pm. Players are encouraged to communicate via ccpickleball@googlegroups.com or through texting to organize ad hoc games on nonscheduled days. Sunshine and low winds can make even chilly days very pleasant on the courts.

In October, the Cove Pickleball group celebrated an outdoor social event on the courts giving us the opportunity to have spouses meet members of the group and put a face to names. We look forward to future socials under more favorable conditions as COVID-19 concerns lessen. October also saw our first experiment with videotaping a group of players to allow each player and coach to evaluate and critique their level of play. We show up and play, while committee members are repairing nets, assuring COVID-19 sanitation measures, securing fence netting, and keeping all our equipment in tip top shape. His most recent contribution was researching and purchasing different balls to allow players to select a ball more suited to their level of play. These balls will be available this spring in separate tubes on the courts.
