



Winter Pickleball Update



Stay positive. It's never too cold to play Pickleball!

As this is being written, we are awaiting some 10 to 16 inches (maybe more) of snow here in the Cove, and Christmas is still more than two weeks away. With that in mind, it is important to remind all players that Pickleball outdoor play will continue throughout the winter months whenever weather permits, which it often does. We will continue play on scheduled days of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 1:00pm to 4:00pm. You are encouraged to use Sign-Up Genius to indicate the days you intend to play, weather permitting, so that other interested players can make plans to play when enough players have signed up. If the weather is such that outdoor play would be possible at a non-scheduled time, an email can be sent to ccpickleball@googlegroups.com to recruit players for an ad hoc game.

Member-Guest Tournament Changes for 2019

Save the date of Saturday June 22nd for a **change to the format of the Member-Guest Golf Tournament**. This year will be a one-day event and we are opening the tournament to member-member teams as well as member-guest teams. This is also the year when our Cummings Cove Cares charity drive takes place. To kick-start the drive on Saturday June 22nd we will hold a Charity Golf Tournament for Members and their Guests.



This year's tournament will have 9-hole, 18-hole and 27-hole divisions. A team can compete in only one division. Divisions will be flighted by handicap if there are enough teams. Teams will consist of two people, either two members or a member and their guest. Teams can consist of two men, two women or a man/woman combination. Handicaps will apply and prizes will be awarded.

The entry fee for a team for this one-day event will be approximately \$95, which will include prizes, dinner and a gift for each player. Green fees and cart fees are being sponsored for this event by our developers.

The start times of the 9-hole, 18-hole and 27-hole formats will be staggered throughout the day to allow for everyone to meet in the clubhouse around 5pm for drinks followed by an informal dinner and awarding of prizes. Spouses and guests who are not playing in the event are welcome to attend the dinner at additional cost. A portion of the team entry fees and hole sponsorship funds will be passed to the Cummings Cove Cares committee for donation to their charity of choice, along with any additional donations raised for optional mulligans and lost balls.

Clubhouse and Golf Shop

Renovations have started on the clubhouse with removal of the fireplace, carpet, wood flooring and tile. The next phase will involve the removal of some walls and the fixtures in the restrooms. Once this is completed, the builders will be able to start the construction phase of the project which will include new entry doors, expansion of the bathrooms, new doors to the dining room, a new meeting room, library and new lighting. A new roof will be installed as well.

During the renovation the Golf Shop has been relocated to the Bag Room in the cart area downstairs. Golfers will need to check in at that location. The street in front of the clubhouse has been closed to traffic and everyone should park in the lower parking lot. Signage has been ordered to help direct the traffic flow.

Construction is underway on the new Golf Shop which will be approximately 1,100 square feet. It will contain an office, check-in counter, sales & display area, restroom, storage and an area for the handicap computer and golfer information. The bag drop will be moved to an area next to the new Golf Shop.

Estimated completion date for both projects is early to mid-April depending on the weather.






Construction Has Begun on The New Cummings Cove Development *The Reserve at Heron Pond*

Work is underway on road prep, sewer and utilities for the new development in Cummings Cove between the 11th golf hole and Cummings Road. Construction of the single family homes and duplexes is expected to begin late winter of 2019 if the weather cooperates. The Reserve at Heron Pond will have room for 18 single family homes and 8 duplexes (16) residences with Craftsman Style exteriors. Single family homes have the option of 1,500 to 2,400 square feet. There is 1,500 square feet on the first level and the second lower level presents options for additional square footage. The duplexes will be 1,750 square feet all on one level. This part of Cummings Cove will be a zero maintenance community and will have a sub-association. Homes in this development will be represented by Cummings Cove Realty.
